
# Centre E F WCentre FIFA Talent Coach Programme Finishing: Dribbling past the defender and scoring



### **Organisation**

- Mark out a 35x25m area with a full-size goal and a goalkeeper at either end.
- Split the players into 2 teams of 6.
- Position 3 blue players to the right of one goal and 3 orange players to the right of the other.
- Position another 3 players from each team on either side of the pitch the opposite side to where their team-mates are positioned by the goal.

#### **Explanation**

- 1 orange player positions themselves in the middle of the pitch.
- The first blue player at the side of the pitch makes a diagonal run toward the orange defender in the middle.
- The first blue player to the right of the goal plays a firm diagonal pass into the path of the blue player making the run.
- The blue player making the run must try to beat the orange defender and score. The orange defender must try to stop them.
- Once a shot has been taken or a goal scored, the orange team initiate the next 1v1 sequence and the blue player who passed the ball becomes the defender.

### **Key coaching points**

- Attacking players should be encouraged to perform different types of directional controls and feints to beat the defender.
- Beating the defender with a directional control and open body position: players should try to draw in the defender by dropping their shoulder and feinting to receive inside before orientating their first touch with their back foot forward into the open
- Beating the defender by meeting the pass on the move with a well-timed run and a directional control forward: attackers should also look to meet the ball, without breaking stride, using their momentum to beat with the defender with a first touch
- Feinting to receive wide before driving inside to meet the ball can help create separation with the defender.

## **Roles of coaches**

- First coach explains the rules and objective of the exercise whilst encouraging players to be brave on the ball.
- Second coach observes and offers occasional encouragement to the players.
- Third coach stays behind one of the goals and helps provide balls.
